Well done to the PTFA for organising a great event!














HARRY POTTER CLUB

PREVENTING BREAST CANCER





Asalaamualiakum,

Dear respected Head teacher and MIGSG staff,

I am writing this email to express my gratitude and appreciation for the recent Umrah and the quality of care our daughters received whilst on the trip. This was my daughter's first experience of the pilgrimage and the first time of seeing the Kaba. She was both inspired and illuminated by the experience. Her **ibadah** has since flourished and she has increased her commitment to improve her practice and reflect upon her daily actions. With no connections abroad and as a revert to Islam, this gift of an Umrah is one of the most precious things I could hope to give my daughter.

The quality of care from staff, especially was exemplary (being as she was my daughter's team leader). This opportunity and quality of guidance would not be received in any other school beyond that of a school with an Islamic faith basis. Any dua my daughter learnt, any salah she actioned, any letter of the Quran she uttered, I remain eternally grateful for it.

Equally, my daughter returns home daily with knowledge as a result of the teachings at the school and attentiveness from the multiple opportunities afforded her in and out of lessons to grow as a young lady with modesty, self-advocacy and self-esteem. To this effect, despite the increase in school fees, and despite our schools not professing to be perfect, I am in awe of the environment my daughter can access in order to be educated in the Deen; to be able to pray in her school day; to be able to hear salaam given and taken; to be able to work with her sisters in Islam in a safe and nutruing multi-cultural context. For this I would pay thousands; for this there is no measure and for this I pledge my energy, efforts and goodwill to a school that offers a sanctuary in an increasingly faith-hostile world.

I am delighted that we have a new building for our young ladies to occupy as the current one sorely needed retiring. I am very grateful for the new accommodation and realise we will need to band together as an unmah to maximise the potential it lends us as we stand at a crossroads for our new journey into an ever challenging world. To that effect, I pledge to pay early the whole of next year's fees, in Ramadan, as I view the increased school fees as an investment not just for my daughter's tuition but as an opportunity to lend my voice, my hands, my heart to support a school beginning its new lease of life: one that may take my daughter to Umrah again, one where a school endeavours to guide my daughter to higher expectations of living Islam, and one where the increase in fees I view more as a Sadaqah Jariyah to insha'Allah accompany me in my grave.






CHESS CLUB





She was pleased to receive a response and was able to thank Mr Smith for this response during his visit to the school. The Head Girl was also able to learn more about Jeff's experience during his previous role as whip and ask him further questions. GCSE Year 10 Students participated in a mock legal trial led by the magistrate judges. The case was of a young girl who had posted some photos and threatening material online. We had the court usher, witnesses, prosecutors and defence teams all in action. The members of the jury were students from Year 8 and Year 9 who decided the verdict.

Thank you to the magistrates who came in, our students were inspired and developed further understanding of how the Magistrates work.

I would like to once again thank you for your hospitality on our visit to the school to offer our Cyber Bullying Mock Trial to your students who I have to say were exceptionally well behaved and who asked some very detailed and thorough questions on both the trial and the law in general.

I hope they had as much fun as we did trying to get across the key elements of the open discussion which was on such wide ranging topics as Bail, restraining orders, youth cases, community sentences and many more I could list.

YEAR 10 CAREERS / GCSE CITIZENSHIP

Careers practice interviews

Y10 had the opportunity to take part in a one to one interview with representatives from different professional businesses on developing the skills of how to improve their interview

technique. Interviewing Our Futures is an event that is designed to introduce students to the interview process, experience what an interview is like, to receive positive feedback of how they performed, and maybe gain some careers guidance along the way. Prior to the event each student initially completes an application form - these are collated and allocated

to a suitable interviewer and distributed roughly one week before the interviews. Each participant is given an appointment slip summarising the details of their appointment - this slip acts as a convenient reminder and also serves as a formal request/permission to leave their lesson on the day of the event. On the day the interviews were conducted in the main school hall and students arrived for their interviews in batches so that interviews all begin at the same time.

"I felt extraordinarily nervous at first, when we had to fill in the small application about how well prepared we were I circled 4. But then, as I entered the hall and went to my assigned table, a wave of overconfidence filled me up and I talked to my interviewer as if I had known her from before, it all went well in the end alhamdulillah and I benefitted massively"

Help your child learn to **filter** information online and navigate fact from fiction.

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
Balance green time and screen time at home. Focus on basic developmental needs.

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
