#### ANTI BULLYING WEEK REACH OUT








For Remembrance Day students took part in a form activity looking at who should be remembered with some information shared in assembly too.



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
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
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#### **STEM CLUB**

Students organised a sports themed cake off, sport being the theme of Charity Week this year. We particularly loved





The Year 7 have been learning the importance of the above verse, and all learnt about the no tolerance policy with regards to bullying at MIGSG.




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## LETTERS TO CANCER PATIENTS


#### RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOL AWARD

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


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#### FRIENDSHIP MONTH—SEPTEMBER




